The Words

Parable - παραβολή - a rhetorical figure of speech, setting one thing beside another to form a comparison or illustration; (1) in the Gospels: *parable, illustration* (Matthew 13:3); (2) in Hebrews, a prophetic element: *symbol, type, figure* (Hebrews 9:9).

Vineyard - ἀμπελών - a piece of land where grapevines are cultivated. The vineyard was recognized as a symbol of Israel itself, as the covenant people, and the members of the Sanhedrin and the better-taught among the crowd could not miss the symbolism.

Slave - $\delta o \hat{\upsilon} \lambda o \zeta$ - one who is a slave in the sense of becoming the property of an owner. This is a transparent reference to the prophets as the servants of God.

Pharisee - $\Phi\alpha\rho\iota\sigma\alpha\hat{\iota}\circ\varsigma$ - a member or follower of the sect of the Pharisees, an organized society of Jews who claimed authority in interpreting the Scriptures and setting rules for law observance in daily life; from the Hebrew: *one who is set apart, a separatist.* These were the ritualists of their day.

Herodians - Ἡρφδιανοί - supporters of Herod the Great and his dynasty. This was the political group aligned with the hated Romans, who were then in power.

Sadducee - Σαδδουκαῖος - member of a Jewish religious and political party in Jerusalem consisting largely of priests claiming descent from the Davidic high priest Zadok, along with their supporters. These were the rationalists of their day, who largely denied the resurrection, the existence of angels and other spirits, and such.

Denarius - δηνάριον - a Roman silver coin equivalent to a workman's average daily wage.

Scribe - γραμματεύς - one skilled in Jewish law and theology: *scribe*, *expert*, *scholar*. These were the authorized religious teachers at this time. Apparently they tended to be proud of their station in life, and rather ostentatious in their behavior. These were the academics of their day.
